Who may apply?

Applicant must be a female, undergraduate student majoring in one of the following disciplines:

- Environmental science or Hydrogeology
- Physical Geography
- Geology
- Geophysics
- Paleoecology
- Paleoclimatology
- Geoscience museum studies
- Paleontology/Evolution

* Applicant's proposed research project must be supervised by a faculty advisor. Scholarship funds will be available by May 1, 2011, and the research project should be completed by May 1, 2012.

* This year **two \$500** scholarships will be awarded.

* Membership in AWG is **NOT** required.

How to apply:

- Complete the application form, a one-page description of your research project, and a budget outline (see guidelines below).
- Enclose an original letter of support from your research supervisor in a sealed envelope that is signed across the flap.
- Enclose a transcript of your coursework (can be an ARTS form).
- Turn in completed application to Geology Office, Rm 120, Lindley Hall
- Scholarship recipient must submit a one to two page description of her results upon completion of her project (due May 1, 2012) OR present a research talk at an AWG brown-bag lunch session (15-20 min).

Project descriptions should include the project title and applicant's name. Application **MUST NOT** exceed one page. The page can be single spaced, with 10 to 12 pt font size, and 1" margins on all sides. On a second page, please provide a brief budget for the proposed work. Support may go towards costs associated with fieldwork, equipment, analytical work, and other expenses at the discretion of the scholarship selection committee.
