## Who may apply?

Applicant must be a **graduate or undergraduate** student of **any gender** pursuing research in the geosciences in the following disciplines:

- Geology
- Hydrogeology
- Physical Geography
- Geophysics
- Soil Sciences
- Paleoecology
- Paleoclimatology
- Paleontology/Evolution
- Or other related geoscience fields

## Award Requirements:

1) If you receive this scholarship, you will be asked to participate in the AWG Brown Bag Lunch presentations (15–20 min) on the funded research.

2) Since this is a service scholarship, you will also be required to participate in one service event within a year following receipt of your award. AWG hosts many outreach activities over the year, thus opportunities to fulfill the service portion of this scholarship should be able to fit any schedule.

**How to apply:**

- Complete the application form, provide a one-page description of your research project, and a budget (see guidelines below).
- Enclose a statement (1 page or less) indicating why you are applying for this service scholarship, why you value AWG’s mission of promoting women in the geosciences, and what you have previously done to promote this mission.
